

Recommendation of English language competency – Study Abroad and Exchange Denmark

Instructions

- Recommendations should be made by the International Office at a student's home institution.
- Whilst this template is offered by the University of Melbourne, the International Office at the student's home institution is encouraged to provide English language recommendations based on their knowledge and assessment of the student.
- The University of Melbourne acknowledges that Danish students commonly acquire English language competency at high school (Studentereksamen), or via tertiary studies. If an applicant is not able to demonstrate English language acquisition through these channels, the recommender may wish to cite alternative examples of English language competence (speaks socially/workplace/travel/family etc).
- The recommendation must be provided on home University letterhead, and contain the recommender's signature and contact details.
