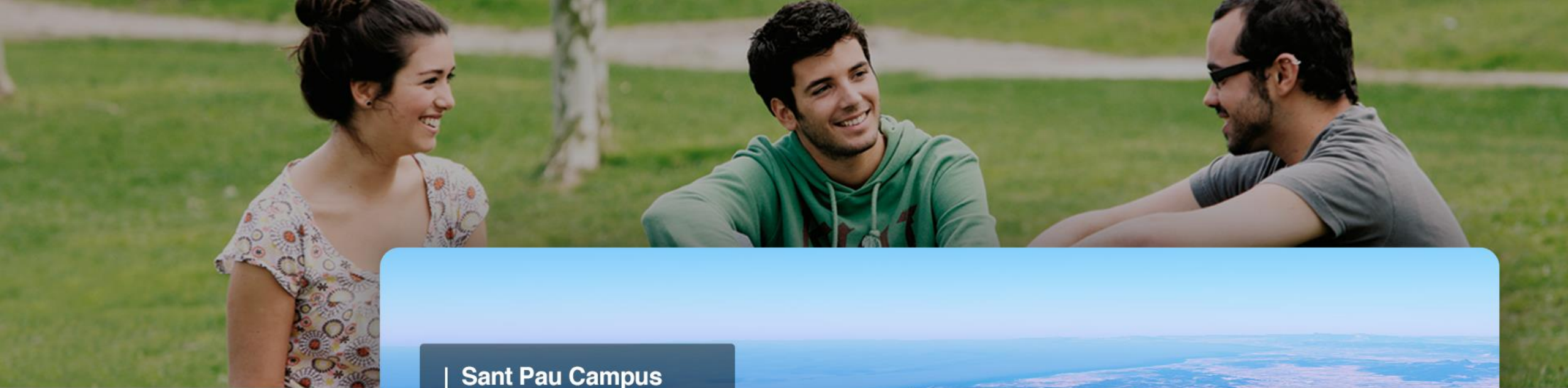

What to expect on your first week in the programme

Orientation Session: January 9th or 10th.

- One week of **add/drop** (**1st to 12th Sept**): students can make changes to their Schedule in our platform SAM
- In class reassessment of **Spanish Language** level by your teachers (mixed groups)
- Final deadline to submit documents for **Academic & Religious Accommodations** (mid-January)
- Get acquainted with our campus, huge UNESCO heritage Building, spacious library, cafeteria on site, many restaurants and coffee shops in the neighbourhood

Our courses

- Maximum **30 students** per class
- Maximum **15 students** per language class
- **International** focus
- Methodology based on student participation, group work and collaborative tasks
- **Continuous assessment:**
oral presentations, group work, case studies, mid-term tests, projects, final exam
- Professors combine **theory with practice**
- **Attendance** and **participation** are key to success

Accommodation and Services

- Cost of shared flat in Barcelona city centre: 400 - 700€/pcm
- Host family: 700-800€/pcm
- Student residences 800-1000 €/pcm
- Deposit of 1 or 2 months
- Contract direct with landlord for the number of months of the programme with the possibility to extend
- 1 month's notice to leave the flat
- Recommended areas: Eixample, Gràcia, Poble Sec, Sagrada Família

- Free access to CAPs (Primary Health Care Centres)
- Call 24hr emergency hospital numbers 608 571 541 (Hospital de Mar) 608 571 542 (Hospital Sant Pau)
- Barcelona City Council and Police offer help and information in English
- Registration at Police Station or Central Registry Office for Foreigners (for EU students who stay more than 3 months in Spain) --> [info link](#)

About Barcelona

- ✓ It's a compact city (1,6 million)
 - ✓ It's multi-cultural and multi-lingual (Spanish, Catalan and English as a lingua franca)
 - ✓ Temperatures vary from 14-30°C
 - ✓ Getting around is easy and cheap on the Metro & bus network

- ✓ It's a safe city, but there are pickpockets – be careful!
 - ✓ Lots of cultural activities and festivals
 - ✓ The Spanish timetable is different:
Shops open till 9.00pm
Locals have dinner after 9.00pm
 - ✓ Nobody has a siesta, except maybe at weekends!
