


#### **Business School Cross-Registration**

- One week window before classes start to cross-register
- Only open to post-baccalaureate and graduate visiting students.
- You can apply for 3 MBA courses and if space permits applicants can enroll for 1 course per semester.
- Only courses with open capacity will be made available for cross-registration.





#### Important Note on WES Evaluations



If your post-secondary credentials are from an institution outside of the United States, the Office of Admissions also requires you to submit a World Education Services, Inc. (WES) course-by-course evaluation for admissions consideration.

This requirement is waived for students applying to our undergraduate visiting student program.

### F-1 Visa Requirements

# International students on an F-1 visa must take a full-time course load:

#### Summer term:

- 6 credits (2 courses) for each 6-week session
- 12 credits (4 courses) for each 12-week session

#### Fall/Spring semesters:

• 12 credits (4 courses)
