# Study abroad at ECU

Study for up to two semesters on undergraduate or postgraduate level. Choose units from all our eight schools to create a unique study program of 3-4 units per semester.



### Two different fee groups

#### Fee Group A

(arts & humanities, business & law, computing, design, teacher education, law, mathematics, science, social science)

- 45 Credit Points (3 x 15 CP units)
  Study Abroad fee \$5.625 = DKK 25.230
- 60 Credit Points (4 x 15 CP units)
  Study Abroad fee \$7.500 = DKK 33.650

#### Fee Group B

(engineering, nursing, medical and health sciences)

- 45 Credit Points (3 x 15 CP units)
  Study Abroad fee \$8.400 = DKK 37.680
- 60 Credit Points (4 x 15 CP units)
  Study Abroad fee \$11.200 = DKK 50.250





# **Entry requirements**

To be eligible for Study Abroad you will need to meet English and Academic entry requirements.

#### **English Requirements (undergraduate and postgraduate)**

You will need an Academic IELTS overall minimum band score of 6.0, with no individual band less than 6.0.

For equivalent tests, please review the English Competency page.

Note: You may satisfy English if you have completed 0.375 equivalent full-time study load (EFTSL) of your university degree in English and are from Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Iceland, Netherlands, Norway, Sweden or Switzerland.

The Study Abroad program can also be packaged with English through one of our pathway providers. This page lists our <u>English language providers</u>.

#### Academic Undergraduate Entry (Band 3)

Admission may be satisfied through the completion of secondary schooling in your home country. To check eligibility, visit our <a href="Secondary School Results page">Secondary School Results page</a> and select your country.

If you have an Australian Qualifications Framework qualification, or have successfully completed 0.25 equivalent full-time study load (EFTSL) at a Bachelor level or higher at an Australian higher education provider (or equivalent) you may also satisfy undergraduate entry requirements.

#### Postgraduate Entry

Admission may be satisfied through the completion of a Bachelor (undergraduate) degree or higher.

#### Accept

#### Arrive in Australia



Students should plan a budget to suit their needs, but make sure it's flexible enough to allow for changes in circumstances.


