² Most master's programs consist of 12 courses (9 core courses and 3 electives) and typically take 4-5 semesters to complete but programs vary in length. Some programs require foundation courses (a maximum of 5). Foundation courses may be exempt based on completed undergraduate coursework.

³ The ESL program consists of 3 levels. Each level consists of 2 terms.

****An application is not complete and full admission cannot be granted until all official documents have been received. If unofficial academic documents are initially provided, a limited admission may be offered once SNHU received a signed Attestation Document from the applicant.**

Note: SNHU recognizes 3-year 180 ECTS credit bachelor's degrees (conferred after 2003, or year of Bologna Process adherence) from institutions in member countries that adhere to the Bologna Process as the equivalent of a 4-year 120 semester credit bachelor's degree from the United States.

3A. Diplomas and Transcripts*

SNHU requires official transcripts and academic documents for full admission, however some applicants may be considered for a limited admission based on unofficial transcripts. For admission consideration, students must provide:

-Official Transcripts and Academic Documents:

Official academic documents must include an official transcript with record of courses and grades/marks received. Transcripts should be issued by the institution in a sealed and stamped envelope and include appropriate authentication or verification based on the institution's country - or sent via a secure transcript service (examples Parchment, National Student Clearinghouse, eScripts, Digitary Core etc.).

Undergraduate GPA Requirements:

- Equivalent of a U.S. high school diploma
 - Minimum GPA: 2.5/4.0 or equivalent
- (Students with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 - 2.49 may be eligible for provisional admission)*

Graduate GPA Requirements:

- Equivalent of a U.S. bachelor's degree
 - Minimum GPA 2.75/4.0 equivalent
- (Students with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 - 2.74 may be eligible for provisional admission)*

SAT, ACT, GMAT or GRE scores are not required for admission.

An application is not complete and full admission cannot be granted until all official documents have been received. Students are encouraged to submit official documents as soon as possible before the term starts as final transcripts may impact first term course requirements. No transfer credits or course waivers will be processed, nor scholarships disbursed, based on unofficial transcripts. An official transcript showing degree conferral must be provided to SNHU by the end of the first term at SNHU or the student will be unable to continue in their degree program.

If considering having credentials evaluated by a credential evaluation service (not required), refer to the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES) for a list of SNHU-approved providers.

*Students applying only for the Intensive English Program do not need to submit an academic diploma and transcript.

3B. English Proficiency Score

Not required for ESL applicants or those planning to study at SNHU's Intensive English Program before matriculation. Students who have completed a degree in the U.S. or have a degree fully taught in English may have the English proficiency score requirement waived. To see the current list of countries where SNHU campus admission will waive the proficiency score requirements for undergraduate and graduate admission, visit our academic catalog at snhu.edu.

- Students from non-English-speaking countries with no proof of English proficiency (or scores below the minimum requirement) will be enrolled in the ESL program prior to their degree program. Indian graduate students are not eligible to enroll in the ESL program.
- TOEFL, PTE and Duolingo scores must be officially reported: SNHU's school code is 3649. SNHU verifies all English proficiency test scores with the testing organizations. Any applicant submitting scores that are inaccurate will be denied admission.

* Subscores are not considered for graduate admission, but may be for undergraduate placement: Undergraduate applicants with 71-78 TOEFL or 6.0 IELTS (and no sub score below 5.5) will be required to take Fundamentals of Writing for International Students concurrent with their academic program. 099i will be waived for undergraduate students with TOEFL 79/IELTS 6.5 or higher.

3C. Proof of Financial Support
