Berkeley Global Access (BGA)

Who: Undergraduate, graduate students and professionals

When: one or two semesters (4.5 or 9 months of study)

What:

Study abroad for **most academic majors**Choose your own courses (space available only)
Study alongside U.S. students
Transfer credits to your university
Professional development workshops and graduate school admissions support

Pace of Study:

Full-time

Required course load: 12–18 units per semester



Berkeley Global Access (BGA) Admission Requirements

1 year of undergraduate coursework

Minimum GPA: 3.0

Minimum English-Language Proficiency: TOEFL 90

The TOEFL requirement is WAIVED for all Danish students

Danish students do <u>not</u> need to provide a TOEFL score

Berkeley Haas Global Access Program

Who: Undergraduate and graduate students, professionals interested in entrepreneurship

When: one or two semesters (4.5 or 9 months of study)

What:

Study at a top-ranked business school
Access to Berkeley Haas' top-ranked faculty
Curriculum focused on entrepreneurship / innovation
Exposure to Silicon Valley startups and companies
Individualized career coaching and workshops
Optional Practical Training (OPT) eligibility after two
semesters of study

Pace of Study:

Full-time

Required course load: 12-15 units per semester

Legal Studies Global Access Program

Who: Undergraduate students interested in legal studies

When: one semester (4.5 months of study)

What:

Study at a top-ranked law school
Focused curriculum on legal studies
Networking events with Berkeley Pre-Law Society
Career and graduate-school advising
Visits to legal firms, California court and prison
Cohort excursions, cultural activities

Pace of Study:

Full-time

Required course load: 13 units per semester

When: one or two semesters (4.5 or 9 months of study)

What:

Study rigorous Physics courses
Unique research opportunities
Study alongside U.S. students (Physics majors)
Opportunity to receive a letter of recommendation
from Berkeley Physics faculty
Academic and professional development workshops
faculty lunches

Pace of Study:

Full-time

Required course load: 12 units per semester

Professional Certificates

Who: University students with three years of study completed, masters students, professionals and career changers

When: one semester or two semesters (4 or 8 months of study)

What:

Gain expertise in a specific subject area Practical, project based learning Exposure to Silicon Valley ecosystem Built in career development course

Pace of Study

Full-time: Monday–Friday; some are on evenings and weekends Required course load: **8 units** + career course

Where:

Classes are held in San Francisco and Berkeley (Extension buildings)

Additional Program Highlights

Career Development Course (1.5 CEUs)

Course is built into the program
Focuses on resume writing, interview preparation, networking, business writing, presentation and leadership skills

Networking/Events

Frequent guest speakers from research and industry Company visits, networking events, panel discussions Seminars, conferences and workshops

Internships

Students can do an internship after completing one semester

Optional Practical Training (OPT)

Students are eligible to apply for OPT after 2 semesters of study

Study Options

One Semester



Two Semesters

Professional Certificates Admission Requirements

Minimum 3 years of undergraduate coursework

Minimum 3.0 GPA

Application Deadlines

Fall 2021: June 28, 2021

<u>Spring 2021:</u> **December 11** (online programs available only)

Internships

- Opportunity to gain work experience at a U.S. company
- Unpaid internships; occasionally paid internships are available after two semesters of study
- Internship must align with certificate subject area (i.e., Entrepreneurship, UI/UX, etc.)
- Only available in the spring and summer
- Must complete one semester of study to participate
- Cost: **\$3,000**

Professional Internship Program:

Optional Practical Training (OPT)

What is OPT?

OPT is a type of U.S. work authorization and a benefit of being in F-1 status.

Who is eligible?

F-1 students who are completing a **certificate** and have completed **2 full-time** semesters.

What type of work can students do?

OPT allows students to work in any type of job (paid, unpaid, self-employment, internship, etc.) that is *related to their field of study* for a maximum of 12 months.

OPT is available after completing 2 semesters of Berkeley Haas Global Access Program (BHGAP) or a professional certificate.
