



Application Deadlines

August Entry: May 1
January Entry: November 1



Completed online application

Proof of financial support (bank statements, loans etc.)

Transcripts, translated to English, for undergraduate/graduate coursework

Valid passport

When admitted, UNCW will issue you a visa eligibility certificate (Form I-20) that you will use to obtain your F-1 visa from the U.S. embassy or consulate. OISS will be here to assist you for your arrival and support you as you settle into your new home.


