



Fremantle

The vibrant city of Fremantle is 30 minutes by train from Perth city. Discover a mix of Australian maritime, convict and colonial history alongside buzzing markets, lively bars and casual street cafés giving you a taste of 21st century life with the locals

Northbridge

Northbridge is home to Perth's Cultural Precinct.

Visit one of the free museums or art galleries, watch a performance at the State Theatre Centre of Western Australia, and indulge in food from around the world at one of the many cafés and restaurants. At night, Northbridge comes alive with the bar and club scene





Rottnest Island

Rottnest is just a short ferry ride from Perth and makes for a perfect day trip. With 63 stunning beaches and coral reefs to explore, jump on a bike and experience the island. Be sure to look out for the island's unique wildlife including the world famous quokka

Kings Park

Located across from UWA and next to the CBD is Kings Park. Larger than Manhattan's Central Park, Kings Park offers spectacular views over the city and Swan River. Explore the park's Botanic Gardens, walk the suspended bridge over the tree tops, or watch a movie under the stars in the outdoor cinema



Cottesloe Beach

Just a 10 minute drive from UWA is Cottesloe Beach. Famous for its swimming, surfing, Indian Ocean sunsets, lively Sunday sessions and world-class annual sculpture park exhibition. Walk along the white sand beaches or dine at one of the stylish eateries overlooking the beach.







Karijini National Park

Valley of the Giants

The Valley of the Giants is an iconic forest region located 4.5 hours south of Perth. The area is world famous for the Tree Top Walk suspended 40 metres high in the canopy of the ancient tingle forest.

You can dive, surf, fish, canoe or walk amongst the flora and fauna along the Bibbulmun Track, beaches and coastal ridges.




Ningaloo Reef

The World Heritage listed Ningaloo Reef is internationally recognised as one of the planet's last great ocean paradises. Swim with the world's biggest fish, the whale shark or join an eco-adventure tour to view a huge variety of marine wildlife including sea turtles, humpback whales, orcas (killer whales) dugong, manta rays, reef sharks and much more!

Cable Beach

Broome's Cable Beach is justifiably world famous for its 22 kilometres of sun-kissed white sand, turquoise water and spectacular Indian Ocean sunsets.

- Completed of 1 semester of study (for Undergraduate entry); or
- Completed a Bachelors degree (for Postgraduate entry)
- Be in "Good Academic Standing" as determined by home institution
- Meet UWA English Language Requirements



English Language Requirements



Tuition fees for 18 points (3 units)/22.5 ECTS: AUD\$10,838 per semester KR 47,013

Tuition fees for 24 points (4 units)/30ECTS: AUD\$14,450 per semester KR 65,430



Perth's transport system is safe, modern, and easy to use.


Central Area Transit (CAT) buses are free to help you get around Perth's key city areas.
