

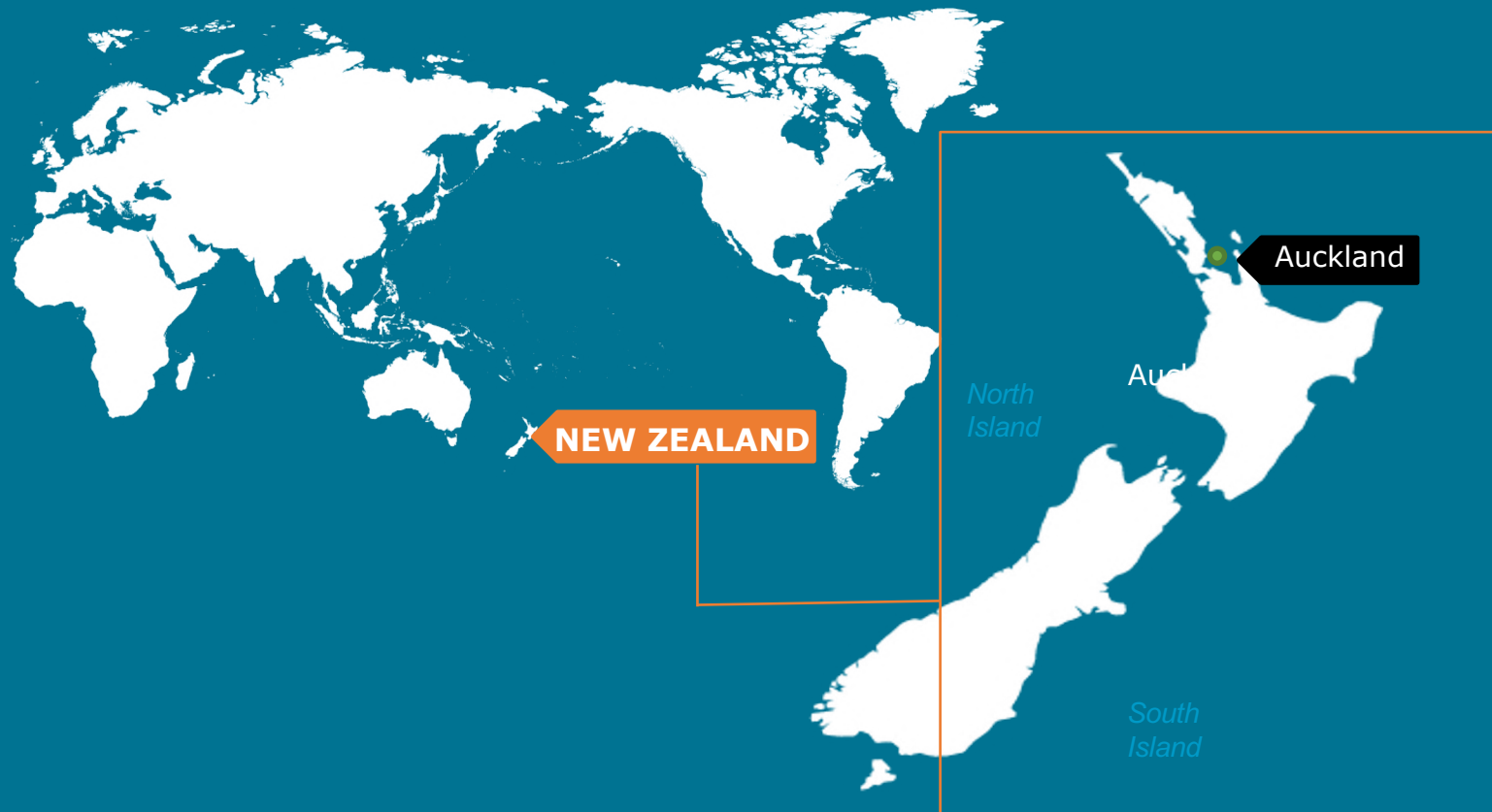

Study Abroad

- Study one semester or two semesters
 - Semester One – End of February to end of June
 - Semester Two – Mid of July to mid of November
- Enroll in 4 courses (either UG or PG) per semester across different disciplines
- Application deadline
 - Semester One – 1 December
 - Semester Two – 1 May
